## CONSENT DECREE

The State of Nevada BOARD of Funeral and Cemetery Services ("BOARD") having jurisdiction over licensee RYAN BOWEN ("BOWEN"), pursuant to NRS 642.5175; a complaint against said license holder having been received alleging violations of the Nevada statutes and regulations controlling the practice of funeral directors; and the parties being mutually desirous of settling the controversy between them relative to the pending complaint;

IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED between the undersigned parties that this matter shall be settled and resolved upon the following terms:

### **VOLUNTARY WAIVER OF RIGHTS**

BOWEN is aware of, understands, and has been advised of the effect of this Consent Decree, which he has carefully read and fully acknowledged. BOWEN has had the opportunity to consult with competent counsel of its choice.

BOWEN has freely and voluntarily entered into this Consent Decree, and is aware of his rights to contest the charges pending against him. These rights include representation by an attorney at his own expense, the right to file an answer in response to a formal complaint, the right to a public hearing on any charges or allegations formally filed, the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses called to testify against him, the right to present evidence on his own behalf, the right to testify on his own behalf, the right to receive written findings of fact and conclusions of law supporting the decision on the merits of the complaint, and the right to obtain judicial review of the decision.

 All of these rights are being voluntarily waived by BOWEN in exchange for the BOARD's acceptance of this Consent Decree.

If the Consent Decree is not accepted by the BOARD, no member of the BOARD will be disqualified from further hearing of this matter, by reason of his or her consideration of the Consent Decree and BOWEN hereby waives any claim of bias or prejudice based upon said consideration by any member of the BOARD in any subsequent disciplinary hearing conducted by the BOARD.

## **JURISDICTION**

BOWEN acknowledges that the BOARD has jurisdiction over him and the conduct alleged in the Complaint. BOWEN acknowledges that the BOARD has the legal power and authority to take disciplinary action, including, but not limited to, the revocation of his license to practice as a funeral director in Nevada.

BOWEN acknowledges that the BOARD will retain jurisdiction over this matter until all terms and conditions set forth in this Consent Decree have been met to the satisfaction of the BOARD.

## PUBLICATION OF CONSENT DECREE

BOWEN acknowledges that at the time this Consent Decree becomes effective, it also becomes a public document and will be reported to the State of Nevada, Legislative Council Bureau, Disciplinary Action Reporting System; and such other national databases as required by law. It is also understood that any meeting during which the BOARD considers and accepts or rejects this Consent Decree is open to the public and that the minutes of the BOARD meeting are a public document, available for inspection by any person so requesting.

## INDEMNIFICATION

BOWEN, for himself, his heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns, hereby indemnifies and holds harmless the State of Nevada, the BOARD, the Nevada Attorney General's office and each of their members, agents and employees in their individual and representative capacities against any and all claims, suits, demands,

 actions, debts, damages, costs, charges, and expenses, including court costs and attorney's fees against any persons, entities, as well as all liability, losses, and damages of any nature whatsoever that the persons and entities named in this paragraph shall have or may at any time sustain or suffer by reason of this investigation, this disciplinary action, this settlement or its administration.

## STIPULATED FACTS AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

BOWEN understands the nature of the allegations under consideration by the BOARD. He acknowledges that the conduct alleged in the Complaint, if proven, constitutes violations of the Nevada Board of Funeral and Cemetery Services Practice Act (NRS and NAC 642) and NRS Chapter 451. He further recognizes that if this matter were to be taken to a disciplinary hearing before the BOARD, there is a substantial likelihood that the following allegations could be proven as true, and that as a result he would be subject to disciplinary action by the BOARD. As such, BOWEN does not contest the following allegations:

- 1. BOWEN held a valid Funeral Director license on the date of the alleged violations and continues to hold a valid Funeral Director license through the present day.
- 2. BOWEN was the approved managing Funeral Director of LA PALOMA FUNERAL SERVICES ("LPFS") on the date of the alleged violations and continues to be the approved managing Funeral Director through the present day.
- 3. The BOARD received a written complaint on or about March 16, 2016, alleging that decedents were not being cremated or buried within a reasonable time after death, specifically, cases receiving payment from Clark County Social Services.
- 4. The investigation revealed two (2) decedents who were not cremated for approximately 120 days after death as the funeral home did not conduct any follow-up or submit any of the necessary paperwork for cremation or burial for over 90 days.
- 5. The investigation revealed one (1) decedent who did not receive cremation or burial for over 90 days after death as the funeral home did not conduct any follow-up or submit any of the necessary paperwork for cremation or burial for over 60 days.

- 6. The investigation revealed that the three (3) decedents referenced in (4) and (5) did not receive any follow-up or submission of required paperwork as the case files had been misplaced on the desk of a former employee of LPFS.
- 7. NRS 642.5174(12) states that unprofessional conduct includes violation of any state law or municipal or county ordinance or regulation affecting the handling, custody, care or transportation of dead human bodies, including, without limitation, chapters 440, 451, and 452 of NRS.
- 8. NRS 642.5174(18) states that unprofessional conduct includes unethical practices contrary to the public interest as determined by the Board.
- 9. NRS 451.020(1) states that every dead body within this state shall be decently buried or cremated within a reasonable time after death.
- 10. NRS 642.345(3) states that a funeral director is responsible for the proper management of each funeral establishment of which the funeral director is the manager.
  - 11. That pursuant to Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 642.5175:

The following acts are grounds for which the Board may take disciplinary action against any person who holds a license, permit or certificate issued by the Board:

- 1. Conviction of a crime involving moral turpitude.
- 2. Unprofessional conduct.
- 3. False or misleading advertising.
- 4. Conviction of a felony relating to the practice of funeral directors.
- 5. Conviction of a misdemeanor that is related directly to the business of a funeral establishment.
- 12. That pursuant to Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 642.5176:
  - 1. If the Board determines that a person who holds a license, permit or certificate issued by the Board has committed any of the acts set forth in NRS 642.5175, the Board may:
    - (a) Refuse to renew the license or permit;
    - (b) Revoke the license or permit;
  - (c) Suspend the license or permit for a definite period or until further order of the Board;
  - (d) Impose a fine of not more than \$5,000 for each act that constitutes a ground for disciplinary action;
  - (e) Place the person on probation for a definite period subject to any reasonable conditions imposed by the Board:
    - (f) Administer a public reprimand; or

(g) Impose any combination of disciplinary actions set forth in paragraphs (a) to (f), inclusive.

2. The Board shall not administer a private reprimand.

3. An order that imposes discipline and the findings of fact and conclusions of law supporting that order are public records.

13. BOWEN does not contest the allegations and acknowledges that as a consequence he is subject to discipline pursuant to the above charges and statutory provisions.

#### STIPULATED ADJUDICATION

BOWEN stipulates that pursuant to the authority of NRS 642.5176, his Funeral Director License No. FD810 shall be placed on probation for six (6) months. During the term of probation, BOWEN agrees to comply with the following conditions:

- 1. Within thirty (30) days of the approval and execution of this Consent Decree, BOWEN shall pay One Hundred Fifty Four dollars (\$154.00) in legal and investigative fees.
- a. No grace period is permitted. Full payment not actually received by the BOARD on or before the thirty days as indicated above, shall be construed as an event of default by BOWEN.
- b. In the event of default, BOWEN agrees that his Funeral Director License shall be immediately suspended. The suspension of BOWEN's license shall continue until the unpaid balance is paid in full and the suspension is subject to being reported to all appropriate agencies.
- c. BOWEN acknowledges that the BOARD has the legal power and authority to take action against him, including instituting debt collection actions for unpaid monetary assessments in this case.
- 2. BOWEN shall submit a report on the last day of each month of probation which includes a list of all decedents under the care of any funeral establishment for which he is the managing funeral director, who have not received burial or cremation within 45 days of death. The report shall include an explanation for any reasons for delay in disposition and efforts that have been made to ensure timely cremation or burial.

information for any decedents under the care of any funeral establishment for which he is the managing funeral director is entered into the Electronic Death Registry System ("EDRS") within (7) seven days of taking custody of the remains of the decedent.

4. BOWEN shall obey all federal, state and local laws, and orders of the

BOWEN shall ensure that at least the minimum available decedent

- 4. BOWEN shall obey all federal, state and local laws, and orders of the BOARD, which are not inconsistent with this Consent Decree, pertaining to the practice of a funeral director in this State. From the date of execution of this Consent Decree until BOWEN satisfies the terms of the Stipulated Adjudication section, BOWEN shall report any and all violations to the BOARD in writing within seventy-two (72) hours.
- 5. BOWEN agrees that he will be financially responsible for all requirements of this Consent Decree, including the cost of any reasonable financial assessments by the BOARD for the cost of monitoring its compliance or carrying out the provisions of this Consent Decree upon a determination of non-compliance with the provisions of this Consent Decree.
- 6. After a minimum of six (6) months, BOWEN may apply to the BOARD for termination of his probation and full reinstatement of his Funeral Director License No. FD810. BOWEN understands that prior to terminating its probation and full reinstatement of his license he must prove to the BOARD's satisfaction that he has complied with all the terms and conditions of its Consent Decree. BOWEN shall submit a written request to the BOARD for termination of his probation. Upon receipt of this request, the BOARD may request additional information from BOWEN to determine his compliance with the Consent Decree. Upon establishing BOWEN has met all of the requirements of the Consent Decree, he shall meet with the Chair of the BOARD or his/her designee, the Executive Director and BOARD counsel for evaluation of its compliance with the Consent Decree and for their recommendation of termination of probation, full reinstatement, or additional disciplinary action at a separate hearing before the BOARD.

## VIOLATION OF TERMS OF CONSENT DECREE

BOWEN understands that the BOARD may, upon thirty (30) days' notice to BOWEN, convene a hearing for the limited purpose of establishing that he violated the terms of this Consent Decree. If such a hearing results in a finding of a violation of this Consent Decree, the BOARD may impose any penalty upon BOWEN authorized by NRS 642.5176 including, but not limited to, revocation of his license to practice as a funeral director in the State of Nevada.

BOWEN agrees to waive his right to appeal the substantive legal basis of the original disciplinary action, which is the basis for this Consent Decree. In the event an alleged violation of the Consent Decree is taken to hearing and the facts which constitute the violation are determined to be not proven, no disciplinary action shall be taken by the BOARD.

## ACCEPTANCE BY THE BOARD

This Consent Decree will be presented and accepted by the BOARD with a recommendation for approval from the Attorney General's Office at its next meeting.

### COMPLETE CONSENT DECREE

This Consent Decree embodies the entire agreement between the BOARD and BOWEN. It may not be altered, amended, or modified without the express written consent of the parties.
