7	CONSENT	DECREE	
8	The State of Nevada Board of Funeral and Cemetery Services ("BOARD") having		
9	jurisdiction over JAMES LEE ("RESPONDENT"), Funeral Director License No. FD69;		
10	pursuant to NRS 642.5175; complaint against said license holder having been received		
11	alleging violations of the Nevada statutes and regulations controlling the practice of		
12	funeral directors and the parties being mutually desirous of settling the controversy		
13	between them relative to the pending complaint;		
14	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED between the undersigned parties that		
15	this matter shall be settled and resolved upon the following terms:		
16	VOLUNTARY WAIVER OF RIGHTS		
17	RESPONDENT is aware of, understands, and has been advised of the effect of this		
18	Consent Decree, which has been carefully read and fully acknowledged. RESPONDENT		
19	has had the opportunity to consult with competent counsel of his choice.		
20	RESPONDENT has freely and voluntarily entered into this Consent Decree, and is		
21	aware of his rights to contest the charges pending against him. These rights include		
22	representation by an attorney at his own expense, the right to file an answer in response		
23	to a formal complaint, the right to a public hearing on any charges or allegations formally		
24	filed, the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses called to testify against him, the		
25	right to present evidence on his own behalf, the right to testify on his own behalf, the right		
26	to receive written findings of fact and conclusions of law supporting the decision on the		
27	merits of the complaint, and the right to obtain	1 judicial review of the decision. All of these	

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1 rights are being voluntarily waived by RESPONDENT in exchange for the BOARD'S 2 acceptance of this Consent Decree.

If the Consent Decree is not accepted by the BOARD, no member of the BOARD will 3 be disgualified from further hearing of this matter, by reason of his or her consideration of 4 the Consent Decree. RESPONDENT hereby waives any claim of bias or prejudice based 5 upon said consideration by any member of the BOARD in any subsequent disciplinary 6 7 hearing conducted by the BOARD.

JURISDICTION

RESPONDENT acknowledges that the BOARD has jurisdiction over him and the 9 conduct alleged in the Complaint. RESPONDENT acknowledges that the BOARD has the 10 legal power and authority to take disciplinary action, including, but not limited to, the 11 12 revocation of his license to practice as a funeral director in Nevada.

RESPONDENT acknowledges that the BOARD will retain jurisdiction over this matter until all terms and conditions set forth in this Consent Decree have been met to the satisfaction of the BOARD.

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PUBLICATION OF CONSENT DECREE

17 **RESPONDENT** acknowledges that at the time this Consent Decree becomes effective, it also becomes a public document and will be reported to the State of Nevada, 18 19 Legislative Council Bureau, Disciplinary Action Reporting System; and such other national 20 databases as required by law. It is also understood that any meeting during which the BOARD considers and accepts or rejects this Consent Decree is open to the public and that 22 the minutes of the BOARD meeting are a public document, available for inspection by any 23 person so requesting.

INDEMNIFICATION

RESPONDENT, for himself, his heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns, hereby indemnifies and holds harmless the State of Nevada, the BOARD, the 27 Nevada Attorney General's office and each of its members, agents and employees in their 28 individual and representative capacities against any and all claims, suits, demands, actions, debts, damages, costs, charges, and expenses, including court costs and attorney's
 fees against any persons and entities as well as all liability, losses, and damages of any
 nature whatsoever that the persons and entities named in this paragraph shall have or
 may at any time sustain or suffer by reason of this investigation, this disciplinary action,
 this settlement or its administration.

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STIPULATED FACTS AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

7 **RESPONDENT** understands the nature of the allegations under consideration by 8 the BOARD. He acknowledges that the conduct alleged in the Complaint, if proven, 9 constitutes violations of the Nevada Board of Funeral and Cemetery Services Practice Act 10 (NRS and NAC 642) and NRS Chapter 451. He further recognizes that if this matter were 11 to be taken to a disciplinary hearing before the BOARD, there is a substantial likelihood 12 that the following allegations could be proven as true, and that as a result he would be 13 subject to disciplinary action by the BOARD. As such, RESPONDENT does not contest the following allegations: 14

RESPONDENT held a valid funeral director license on the date of the alleged
 violations and continues to hold a valid funeral director license through the present day.

RESPONDENT was the managing funeral director for HITES FUNERAL
 HOME AND CREMATORY ("HITES") on the date of the alleged violations and continues
 to be the managing funeral director of HITES through the present day.

3. The BOARD initiated a complaint on or about July 30, 2019, alleging Clark
County Social Services removed HITES from its social services contract because there were
too many bodies being stored at the establishment for extended periods of time thereby
raising concerns about how it was caring for the bodies.

a. It is alleged that Davis Funeral Home is currently in possession of
many social services bodies received from HITES and there is information indicating that
deceased individuals were stored at HITES for months (in several cases over a year)
without transferring the permits or finalizing disposition.

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4. The second complaint was initiated as a result of an inspection performed by
 the BOARD inspector.

a. It is alleged that the BOARD inspector noticed many discrepancies on
the funeral establishment's records with the spelling of names of decedents and dates of
death.

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b.

The inspection report noted the following:

i. Bodies that had been in the care of the funeral home for extended
8 periods of time;

9 ii. The location was not being maintained in a sanitary and
10 professional manner as there were bodily fluids seeping onto shelves and soaking sheeting
11 without being properly cleaned.

12 5. NRS 642.5174(1) states that unprofessional conduct includes
13 misrepresentation or fraud in the operation of a funeral establishment, direct cremation
14 facility, cemetery or crematory, or the practice of a funeral director or funeral arranger.

6. NRS 642.5174(11) states that unprofessional conduct includes violation of any
provision of this chapter, any regulation adopted thereto or any order of the Board.

17 7. NRS 642.5174(12) states that unprofessional conduct includes violation of any
18 state law or municipal or county ordinance affecting the handling, custody, care or
19 transportation of dead human bodies, including, without limitation, chapters 440, 451 and
20 452 of NRS.

8. NRS 642.5174(15) states that unprofessional conduct includes taking undue
advantage of the patrons of a funeral establishment or direct cremation facility, or being
guilty of fraud or misrepresentation in the sale of merchandise to those patrons.

9. NRS 642.345(3) states that a funeral director is responsible for the proper
management of each funeral establishment or direct cremation facility of which the funeral
director is the manager.

27 10. NRS 642.5174(18) states that unprofessional conduct includes unethical
28 practices contrary to the public interest as determined by the Board.

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1 11. NRS 440.450 states that the funeral director or person acting as undertaker
 is responsible for obtaining and filing the certificate of death with the local health officer,
 or his or her deputy, in the registration district in which the death occurred, and for
 securing a burial or removal permit prior to any disposition of the body.

5 12. NRS 440.490 states that the funeral director or person acting as undertaker
6 shall present the completed certificate of death to the local registrar within 72 hours after
7 the occurrence or discovery of the death. If a case is referred to the coroner, he or she shall
8 present a completed certificate to the local registrar upon disposition of the investigation.

9 13. NRS 451.020 states that every dead body lying within this state shall be
10 decently buried or cremated with a reasonable time after death.

11 14. NRS 451.675(1)(a) and (b) states that if the operator of a crematory cannot
12 cremate human remains immediately after receiving them, the operator shall place them
13 in a holding facility within or adjacent to the crematory which preserves the dignity of the
14 remains and protects for the health and safety of employees of the operator.

15. NAC 451.070(1) and (2) states that the operator of a crematory, funeral
establishment or direct cremation facility shall ensure that any human remains awaiting
cremation are properly identified at all times and the identity of the human remains is
maintained throughout the entire cremation process.

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16. NAC 642.158(6) states that the premises of any location where human remains are stored must be maintained in a sanitary and professional manner.

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The following acts are grounds for which the Board may take disciplinary action against a person who holds a license, permit, or certificate issued by the Board pursuant to this chapter or chapter 451 or chapter 452 of NRS, or may refuse to issue such a license, permit, or certificate to an applicant therefor:

That pursuant to Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 642.5175:

- 1) Conviction of a crime involving moral turpitude.
- 2) Unprofessional conduct.
- 3) False or misleading advertising.
- 4) Conviction of a felony relating to the practice of funeral directors or funeral arrangers.
- 5) Conviction of a misdemeanor that is related directly to the business of a funeral establishment, direct cremation facility, cemetery, or crematory.

1 That pursuant to Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 642.5176: 18. If the Board determines that a person who holds a license, permit 2 or certificate issued by the Board pursuant to this chapter or chapter 451 or 452 of NRS has committed any of the acts set forth 3 in NRS 642.5175 the Board may: 4 1) Refuse to renew the license or permit; 2) Revoke the license or permit; 5 3) Suspend the license or permit for a definite period or until further order of the Board; 6 4) Impose a fine of not more than \$5,000 for each act that constitutes a ground for disciplinary action: 7 5) Place the person on probation for a definite period subject to any reasonable conditions imposed by the Board; 8 6) Administer a public reprimand; or 7) Impose any combination of disciplinary actions set forth in 9 paragraphs (a) to (f), inclusive. a) The Board shall not administer a private reprimand. 10 b) An order that imposes discipline and the findings of fact and conclusions of law supporting that order are public 11 records. RESPONDENT does not contest the allegations in the Complaint, and 12 19. 13 acknowledges that as a consequence they are subject to discipline pursuant to the above charges and statutory provisions. 14 STIPULATED ADJUDICATION 15 16 **RESPONDENT** stipulates that pursuant to the authority of NRS 642.5176, the BOARD will impose a SUSPENSION of his funeral director license FD69 for six (6) months. 17 After six (6) months of SUSPENSION, RESPONDENT's funeral director license shall be 18 placed on probation for one (1) year. During the term of the probation, RESPONDENT 19 agrees to comply with the following conditions: 20 1. 21 Within thirty (30) days of the approval and execution of this Consent Decree, 22 RESPONDENT shall six hundred eighty-six and 90/100 dollars (\$686.90) attorney's fees and costs and one thousand dollars (\$1,000) in administrative fines. 23 24 a. No grace period is permitted. Full payment not actually received by the BOARD on or before the thirty days as indicated above, shall be construed as an event 25of default by RESPONDENT. 26 b. 27 In the event of default, RESPONDENT agrees that his funeral director 28 license shall be immediately suspended. The suspension of RESPONDENT license to

practice as a funeral director shall continue until the unpaid balance is paid in full and the
 suspension is subject to being reported to all appropriate agencies.

Within ninety (90) days of the approval and execution of this Consent Decree,
RESPONDENT shall attend at least twelve (12) hours of courses pre-approved by the
Board Executive Director on the issue of funeral service ethics. These continuing education
courses may not be applied towards the continuing education requirements for the
maintenance of RESPONDENT's licenses.

8 3. RESPONDENT shall obey all federal, state and local laws, and orders of the
9 BOARD, which are not inconsistent with this Consent Decree, pertaining to funeral
10 directing in this State. Any and all violations shall be reported by RESPONDENT to the
11 BOARD in writing within seventy-two (72) hours.

4. RESPONDENT agrees that he will be financially responsible for all
requirements of this Consent Decree and any reasonable financial assessments by the
Board for the Cost of monitoring his compliance or carrying out the provisions of this
Consent Decree.

5. After the one (1) year of probation, RESPONDENT shall submit a written 16 17 request to the BOARD for termination of the probation. RESPONDENT understands that prior to terminating the probation he must prove to the BOARD's satisfaction that he has 18 complied with all the terms and conditions of the Consent Decree. The BOARD may 19 request additional information from RESPONDENT to determine compliance with the 20 terms of the Consent Decree and may require him to meet with the Executive Director and 21 BOARD counsel for further evaluation of its compliance with the Consent Decree. If the 22 BOARD does not request additional information or initiate any further investigation, the 23 probation shall be automatically terminated. 24

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VIOLATION OF TERMS OF CONSENT DECREE

RESPONDENT understands that the BOARD may, upon thirty (30) days' notice to respondent, convene a hearing for the limited purpose of establishing that he violated the terms of this Consent Decree. If such a hearing results in a finding of a violation of this

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1	Consent Decree, the BOARD may impose any penalty upon RESPONDENT authorized by	
2	NRS 642.5176	
3	RESPONDENT agrees to waive his rights to appeal the substantive legal basis of	
4	the original disciplinary action, which is the basis for this Consent Decree. In the event ar	
5	alleged violation of the Consent Decree is taken to hearing and the facts that constitute the	
6	violation are determined to be not proven, no disciplinary action shall be taken by the	
7	BOARD.	
8	ACCEPTANCE BY THE BOARD	
9	This Consent Decree will be presented and accepted by the BOARD with a	
10	recommendation for approval from the Attorney General's Office at its next meeting.	
11	COMPLETE CONSENT DECREE	
12	This Consent Decree embodies the entire agreement between the BOARD and	
13	RESPONDENT. It may not be altered, amended, or modified without the express written
