#### CONSENT DECREE

The State of Nevada Board of Funeral and Cemetery Services ("BOARD") having jurisdiction over McDERMOTT's FUNERAL AND CREMATION SERVICE, Establishment Permit No. EST110 and CHRISTOPHER M. GRANT, Funeral Director License No. FD920 ("RESPONDENTS"), pursuant to NRS 642.5175; complaint against said permit and license holders having been received alleging violations of the Nevada statutes and regulations controlling funeral establishment facilities and funeral directors; and the parties being mutually desirous of settling the controversy between them relative to the pending complaint;

IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED between the undersigned parties that this matter shall be settled and resolved upon the following terms:

#### **VOLUNTARY WAIVER OF RIGHTS**

RESPONDENTS are aware of, understand, and have been advised of the effect of this Consent Decree, which they have carefully read and fully acknowledged. RESPONDENTS have had the opportunity to consult with competent counsel of their choice.

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RESPONDENTS have freely and voluntarily entered into this Consent Decree, and are aware of their rights to contest the charges. These rights include representation by an attorney at their own expense, the right to file an answer in response to a formal complaint, the right to a public hearing on any charges or allegations formally filed, the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses called to testify against them, the right to present evidence on their own behalf, the right to testify on their own behalf, the right to receive written findings of fact and conclusions of law supporting the decision on the merits of the complaint, and the right to obtain judicial review of the decision. All of these rights are being voluntarily waived by RESPONDENTS in exchange for the BOARD'S acceptance of this Consent Decree.

If the Consent Decree is not accepted by the BOARD, no member of the BOARD will be disqualified from further hearing of this matter, by reason of his or her consideration of the Consent Decree. RESPONDENTS hereby waive any claim of bias or prejudice based upon said consideration by any member of the BOARD in any subsequent disciplinary hearing conducted by the BOARD.

## **JURISDICTION**

RESPONDENTS acknowledge that the BOARD has jurisdiction over it and the conduct alleged in the Complaint. RESPONDENTS acknowledge that the BOARD has the legal power and authority to take disciplinary action, including, but not limited to, the revocation of permits to operate a funeral establishment facility and practice funeral directing in Nevada.

RESPONDENTS acknowledge that the BOARD will retain jurisdiction over this matter until all terms and conditions set forth in this Consent Decree have been met to the satisfaction of the BOARD.

#### PUBLICATION OF CONSENT DECREE

RESPONDENTS acknowledge that at the time this Consent Decree becomes effective, it also becomes a public document and will be reported to the State of Nevada, Legislative Council Bureau, Disciplinary Action Reporting System; and such other national

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databases as required by law. It is also understood that any meeting during which the BOARD considers and accepts or rejects this Consent Decree is open to the public and that the minutes of the BOARD meeting are a public document, available for inspection by any person so requesting.

#### **INDEMNIFICATION**

RESPONDENTS, for themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns, hereby indemnifies and hold harmless the State of Nevada, the BOARD, the Nevada Attorney General's office and each of its members, agents and employees in their individual and representative capacities against any and all claims, suits, demands, actions, debts, damages, costs, charges, and expenses, including court costs and attorney's fees against any persons entities as well as all liability, losses, and damages of any nature whatsoever that the persons and entities named in this paragraph shall have or may at any time sustain or suffer by reason of this investigation, this disciplinary action, this settlement or its administration.

#### STIPULATED FACTS AND CONCLUSION OF LAW

RESPONDENTS understand the nature of the allegations under consideration by the BOARD. They acknowledge that the conduct alleged in the complaint, if proven, constitutes violations of the Nevada Board of Funeral and Cemetery Services Practice Act (NRS and NAC 642). They further recognize that if this matter were to be taken to a disciplinary hearing before the BOARD, there is a substantial likelihood that the following allegations could be proven as true, and that as a result they would be subject to disciplinary action by the BOARD. As such, RESPONDENTS do not contest the following allegations:

- 1.e RESPONDENTS held valid permits to operate the funeral establishmente facility and a valid funeral director license referenced in this document on the date of the alleged violation, and continue to hold said licenses and permits through the present day.
- 2.e A complaint was received by the BOARD on or about February 6, 2021, alleging the following:

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- 6. NRS 642.5174(15) states that unprofessional conduct includes taking unfaire advantage of the patrons of a funeral establishment or direct cremation facility, or being guilty of fraud or misrepresentation in the sale of merchandise to those patrons.
- 7. NRS 642.5174(18) states that unprofessional conduct includes unethicale practices contrary to the public interest as determined by the Board.
- 8. NRS 451.020 states that every dead body of a human being lying within thise state, shall be decently cremated or buried within a reasonable time after death.

9.e NRS 642.345(3) which states the funeral director is responsible for the propere management of each funeral establishment or direct cremation facility that he or she manages.

# 10.e That pursuant to Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 642.5175:e

The following acts are grounds for which the Board may take disciplinary action against a person who holds a license, permit, or certificate issued by the Board pursuant to this chapter or chapter 451 or chapter 452 of NRS, or may refuse to issue such a license, permit, or certificate to an applicant therefor:

1.e Conviction of a crime involving moral turpitude.e

2.e Unprofessional conduct.e

3.e False or misleading advertising.e

4.e Conviction of a felony relating to the practice of funerale

directors or funeral arrangers.e

5.eConviction of a misdemeanor that is related directly to thee business of a funeral establishment, direct cremation facility,e cemetery, or crematory.e

# 11.e That pursuant to Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 642.5176:e

If the Board determines that a person who holds a license, permite or certificate issued by the Board pursuant to this chapter ore chapter 451 or 452 of NRS has committed any of the acts set for the in NRS 642.5175 the Board may:

(a) Refuse to renew the license or permit:

(b) Revoke the license or permit; e

(c)eSuspend the license or permit for a definite period or untile further order of the Board;e

(d) Impose a fine of not more than \$5,000 for each act thate constitutes a ground for disciplinary action;

(e)ePlace the person on probation for a definite period subjecte

to any reasonable conditions imposed by the Board;

(f)eAdminister a public reprimand; ore

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(g) Impose any combination of disciplinary actions set forth in paragraphs (a) to (f), inclusive.

2.t The Board shall not administer a private reprimand.t 3.t An order that imposes discipline and the findings of fact andt conclusions of law supporting that order are public records.t

12.t RESPONDENTS do not contest the allegations in the Complaint, and acknowledge that as a consequence are subject to discipline pursuant to the above charges and statutory provisions.

# STIPULATED ADJUDICATION

RESPONDENTS stipulate that pursuant to the authority of NRS 642.5176, the BOARD will administer a PUBLIC REPRIMAND and RESPONDENTS must comply with the following conditions:

- 1. Within thirty (30) days of the approval and execution of this Consent Decree,t RESPONDENTS shall pay six hundred sixty-three and 74/100 dollars (\$663.74) in attorney's fees and costs.
  - a. No grace period is permitted. Full payment not actually received by the BOARD on or before the thirty days as indicated above, shall be construed as an event of default by RESPONDENTS.
  - b. In the event of default, RESPONDENTS agree that its funeral establishment permit, crematory license, and funeral director license shall be immediately suspended. The suspension of RESPONDENTS permit and licenses shall continue until the unpaid balance is paid in full and the suspension is subject to being reported to all appropriate agencies.
- 2. RESPONDENTS shall make a reasonable effort to pick up cases within fortyeight (48) hours of receiving the signed release.
- 3. RESPONDENTS shall obey all federal, state and local laws, and orders of thet BOARD, which are not inconsistent with this Consent Decree, pertaining to operating a

crematory in this State. Any and all violations shall be reported by RESPONDENTS to the BOARD in writing within seventy-two (72) hours.

4.e RESPONDENTS agree that it will be financially responsible for alle requirements of this Consent Decree and any reasonable financial assessments by the Board for the cost of monitoring its compliance or carrying out the provisions of this Consent Decree.

# VIOLATION OF TERMS OF CONSENT DECREE

RESPONDENTS understand that the BOARD may, upon thirty (30) days' notice to respondents, convene a hearing for the limited purpose of establishing that they violated the terms of this Consent Decree. If such a hearing results in a finding of a violation of this Consent Decree, the BOARD may impose any penalty upon RESPONDENT authorized by NRS 642.5176.

RESPONDENT agrees to waive its rights to appeal the substantive legal basis of the original disciplinary action, which is the basis for this Consent Decree. In the event an alleged violation of the Consent Decree is taken to hearing and the facts which constitute the violation are determined to be not proven, no disciplinary action shall be taken by the BOARD.

#### ACCEPTANCE BY THE BOARD

This Consent Decree will be presented and accepted by the BOARD with a recommendation for approval from the Attorney General's Office at its next meeting.

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## COMPLETE CONSENT DECREE

This Consent Decree embodies the entire agreement between the BOARD and RESPONDENT. It may not be altered, amended, or modified without the express written consent of the parties.
