12	CONSENT DECREE				
13	The State of Nevada Board of Funeral and Cemetery Services (BOARD) having				
14	jurisdiction over DESERT MEMORIAL Establishment Permit No EST46 and KRISTEN				
15	ANDERSON Funeral Director License No. FD860 (RESPONDENTS), pursuant to NF	3S			
16	642.5175; complaint against said permit and license holders having been received alleging				
17	violations of the Nevada statutes and regulations controlling funeral establishments and				
18	funeral directors; and the parties being mutually desirous of settling the controversy				
19	between them relative to the pending complaint;				
20	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED between the undersigned parties that				
21	this matter shall be settled and resolved upon the following terms:				
22	VOLUNTARY WAIVER OF RIGHTS	-			
23	RESPONDENTS are aware of, understand, and have been advised of the effect	of			
24	this Consent Decree, which they have carefully read and fully acknowledge	d.			
25	RESPONDENTS have had the opportunity to consult with competent counsel of the	ir			
26	choice.				
27	<b>RESPONDENTS</b> have freely and voluntarily entered into this Consent Decree, ar	bt			
28	are aware of their rights to contest the charges. These rights include representation by a	an			

attorney at their own expense, the right to file an answer in response to a formal complaint. 1 the right to a public hearing on any charges or allegations formally filed, the right to 2 confront and cross-examine witnesses called to testify against them, the right to present 3 evidence on their own behalf, the right to testify on their own behalf, the right to receive 4 written findings of fact and conclusions of law supporting the decision on the merits of the 5 complaint, and the right to obtain judicial review of the decision. All of these rights are 6 being voluntarily waived by RESPONDENTS in exchange for the BOARD'S acceptance of 7 this Consent Decree. 8

9 If the Consent Decree is not accepted by the BOARD, no member of the BOARD will
10 be disqualified from further hearing of this matter, by reason of his or her consideration of
11 the Consent Decree. RESPONDENTS hereby waive any claim of bias or prejudice based
12 upon said consideration by any member of the BOARD in any subsequent disciplinary
13 hearing conducted by the BOARD.

# JURISDICTION

RESPONDENTS acknowledge that the BOARD has jurisdiction over it and the conduct alleged in the Complaint. RESPONDENTS acknowledge that the BOARD has the legal power and authority to take disciplinary action, including, but not limited to, the revocation of permits to operate a funeral establishment and practice funeral directing in Nevada.

20 RESPONDENTS acknowledge that the BOARD will retain jurisdiction over this 21 matter until all terms and conditions set forth in this Consent Decree have been met to the 22 satisfaction of the BOARD.

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### **PUBLICATION OF CONSENT DECREE**

RESPONDENTS acknowledge that at the time this Consent Decree becomes effective, it also becomes a public document and will be reported to the State of Nevada, Legislative Council Bureau, Disciplinary Action Reporting System; and such other national databases as required by law. It is also understood that any meeting during which the BOARD considers and accepts or rejects this Consent Decree is open to the public and that

the minutes of the BOARD meeting are a public document, available for inspection by any 1 person so requesting. 2

### INDEMNIFICATION

RESPONDENTS, for themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors 4 and assigns, hereby indemnifies and hold harmless the State of Nevada, the BOARD, the 5 Nevada Attorney General's office and each of its members, agents and employees in their 6 individual and representative capacities against any and all claims, suits, demands, 7 actions, debts, damages, costs, charges, and expenses, including court costs and attorney's 8 fees against any persons entities as well as all liability, losses, and damages of any nature 9 whatsoever that the persons and entities named in this paragraph shall have or may at 10 any time sustain or suffer by reason of this investigation, this disciplinary action, this 11 settlement or its administration. 12

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# STIPULATED FACTS AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

**RESPONDENTS** understand the nature of the allegations under consideration by 14 the BOARD. They acknowledge that the conduct alleged in the complaint, if proven, 15 constitutes violations of the Nevada Board of Funeral and Cemetery Services Practice Act 16 (NRS and NAC 642). They further recognize that if this matter were to be taken to a 17 disciplinary hearing before the BOARD, there is a substantial likelihood that the following 18 allegations could be proven as true, and that as a result they would be subject to 19 disciplinary action by the BOARD. As such, RESPONDENTS do not contest the following 20 allegations: 21

1. **RESPONDENTS** held a valid permit to operate the funeral establishment and 22 a valid funeral director license referenced in this document on the date of the alleged 23 violation, and continue to hold said license and permit through the present day. 24

A complaint was received by the BOARD on or about March 30, 2021 alleging 2. the following: 26

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Decedent RP died on February 6, 2021, and RESPONDENTS provided 1 8. the final arrangements. 2 Decedent's family contracted and paid for a military service that b. 3 included the appearance of military personnel to attend the funeral. 4 C. Decedent's family claim that no military personnel were in attendance 5 during the funeral services. 6 d. Decedent's family claim Ms. Anderson falsely stated at the time of the 7 funeral that military would not be in attendance due to Covid restrictions. 8

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9 e. At the Southern Nevada Veteran Cemetery, where Decedent's funeral
10 services were being performed, Decedent's family was informed that military personnel
11 performed military honors for another service earlier that morning.

f. In addition, RESPONDENTS were late in delivering decedent and his
 cremains arrived in an urn the family did not purchase.

g. The cremains then had to be transferred to another urn and the wall,
which would be the cremains final resting place, had to be reopened to accept the urn
purchased by the family.

h. Decedent's family claims to have suffered emotional distress due to the
aforementioned allegations.

3. NRS 642.5174(1) states that unprofessional conduct includes
 misrepresentation or fraud in the operation of a funeral establishment, direct cremation
 facility, cemetery or crematory, or the practice of a funeral director or funeral arranger.

4. NRS 642.5174(11) states that unprofessional conduct includes violation of any
provision of this chapter, any regulation adopted thereto or any order of the Board.

5. NRS 642.5174(15) states that unprofessional conduct includes taking undue
advantage of patrons of a funeral establishment or direct cremation facility, or being guilty
of fraud or misrepresentation in the sale of merchandise to those patrons.

27 6. NRS 642.5174(18) states that unprofessional conduct includes unethical
28 practices contrary to the public interest as determined by the Board.

1	7.	NRS 642.345(3) which states the funeral director is responsible for the proper					
2	management of each funeral establishment or direct cremation facility that he or she						
3	manages.						
4	8.	That pursuant to Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 642.5175:					
5		The following acts are grounds for which the Board may					
6		take disciplinary action against a person who holds a license, permit, or certificate issued by the Board pursuant to this chapter					
7		or chapter 451 or chapter 452 of NRS, or may refuse to issue such a license, permit, or certificate to an applicant therefor:					
8		1. Conviction of a crime involving moral turpitude.					
9		<ol> <li>Unprofessional conduct.</li> <li>False or misleading advertising.</li> </ol>					
10		4. Conviction of a felony relating to the practice of funeral directors or funeral arrangers.					
11		5. Conviction of a misdemeanor that is related directly to the business of a funeral establishment, direct cremation facility,					
12		cemetery, or crematory.					
13	9.	That pursuant to Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 642.5176:					
14		If the Board determines that a person who holds a license, permit or certificate issued by the Board pursuant to this chapter					
15 16		or chapter 451 or 452 of NRS has committed any of the acts set forth in NRS 642.5175 the Board may:					
17		(a) Refuse to renew the license or permit;					
18		(b) Revoke the license or permit; (c) Suspend the license or permit for a definite period or until further order of the Board;					
19		(d) Impose a fine of not more than \$5,000 for each act that constitutes a ground for disciplinary action;					
20		(e) Place the person on probation for a definite period subject to any reasonable conditions imposed by the Board;					
21		(f) Administer a public reprimand; or (g) Impose any combination of disciplinary actions set forth in					
22		paragraphs (a) to (f), inclusive.					
23		<ol> <li>The Board shall not administer a private reprimand.</li> <li>An order that imposes discipline and the findings of fact and</li> </ol>					
24		conclusions of law supporting that order are public records.					
25	10.	RESPONDENTS do not contest the allegations in the Complaint, and					
26	acknowledg	e that as a consequence are subject to discipline pursuant to the above charges					
27	and statuto	ry provisions.					
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1	STIPULATED ADJUDICATION
2	RESPONDENTS stipulate that pursuant to the authority of NRS 642.5176, the
3	BOARD will administer a PUBLIC REPRIMAND and RESPONDENTS must comply with
4	the following conditions:
5	1. Within thirty (30) days of the approval and execution of this Consent Decree,
6	RESPONDENTS shall pay eight hundred eighty-seven and 86/100 dollars (\$887.86) in
7	attorney's fees and costs and three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) in administrative fines
8	(\$1,500 assessed to Serenity VLL, LLC and \$1,500 assessed to Ms. Kristen Anderson).
9	RESPONDENTS may contact the BOARD within thirty (30) days and submit a proposal
10	in writing and propose a reasonable request for a monthly payment plan to reimburse the
11	BOARD.
12	a. No grace period is permitted. Full payment not actually received by
13	the BOARD on or before the thirty days as indicated above, shall be
14	construed as an event of default by RESPONDENTS.
15	b. In the event of default, RESPONDENTS agree that their funeral
16	establishment permit and funeral director license shall be immediately
17	suspended. The suspension of RESPONDENTS' permit and license
18	shall continue until the unpaid balance is paid in full and the
19	suspension is subject to being reported to all appropriate agencies.
20	2. RESPONDENTS shall obey all federal, state and local laws, and orders of the
21	BOARD, which are not inconsistent with this Consent Decree, pertaining to operating a
22	funeral establishment and practicing funeral directing in this State. Any and all violations
23	shall be reported by RESPONDENTS to the BOARD in writing within seventy-two (72)
24	hours.
25	4. RESPONDENTS agree that it will be financially responsible for all
26	requirements of this Consent Decree and any reasonable financial assessments by the
27	Board for the cost of monitoring its compliance or carrying out the provisions of this
28	Consent Decree.
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<b>VIOLATION OF T</b>	ERMS OF	CONSENT	DECREE
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RESPONDENTS understand that the BOARD may, upon thirty (30) days' notice to
RESPONDENTS, convene a hearing for the limited purpose of establishing that they
violated the terms of this Consent Decree. If such a hearing results in a finding of a
violation of this Consent Decree, the BOARD may impose any penalty upon
RESPONDENTS authorized by NRS 642.5176.

RESPONDENTS agree to waive their rights to appeal the substantive legal basis of
the original disciplinary action, which is the basis for this Consent Decree. In the event an
alleged violation of the Consent Decree is taken to hearing and the facts which constitute
the violation are determined to be not proven, no disciplinary action shall be taken by the
BOARD.

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#### **ACCEPTANCE BY THE BOARD**

This Consent Decree will be presented and accepted by the BOARD with a
recommendation for approval from the Attorney General's Office at its next meeting.

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1	COMPLETE CONSENT DECREE
2	This Consent Decree embodies the entire agreement between the BOARD and
3	RESPONDENTS. It may not be altered, amended, or modified without the express writter
4	consent of the parties.
