CONSENT DECREE

The State of Nevada BOARD of Funeral and Cemetery Services ("BOARD") having 9 jurisdiction over permittee DAVIS FUNERAL HOME ("DFH"), pursuant to NRS 10 11 642.5175; complaint against said permit holder alleging violations of the Nevada statutes and regulations controlling the practice of funeral establishments; and the parties being 12 13 mutually desirous of settling the controversy between them relative to the pending complaint; 14

IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED between the undersigned parties 16 that this matter shall be settled and resolved upon the following terms:

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VOLUNTARY WAIVER OF RIGHTS

18 DFH is aware of, understands, and has been advised of the effect of this Consent Decree, which it has carefully read and fully acknowledged. DFH has had the 20 opportunity to consult with competent counsel of its choice.

21 DFH has freely and voluntarily entered into this Consent Decree, and is aware of 22 its rights to contest the charges pending against the establishment. These rights include 23 representation by an attorney at its own expense, the right to file an answer in response 24 to a formal complaint, the right to a public hearing on any charges or allegations formally 25 filed, the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses called to testify against it, the 26 right to present evidence on its own behalf, the right to testify on its own behalf, the right to receive written findings of fact and conclusions of law supporting the decision on the 27 28 merits of the complaint, and the right to obtain judicial review of the decision.

All of these rights are being voluntarily waived by DFH in exchange for the BOARD'S acceptance of this Consent Decree.

If the Consent Decree is not accepted by the BOARD, no member of the BOARD will be disqualified from further hearing of this matter, by reason of his or her consideration of the Consent Decree and DFH hereby waives any claim of bias or prejudice based upon said consideration by any member of the BOARD in any subsequent disciplinary hearing conducted by the BOARD.

JURISDICTION

DFH acknowledges that the BOARD has jurisdiction over it and the conduct alleged in the Complaint. DFH acknowledges that the BOARD has the legal power and authority to take disciplinary action, including, but not limited to, the revocation of its permit to operate a funeral establishment in Nevada.

DFH acknowledges that the BOARD will retain jurisdiction over this matter until all terms and conditions set forth in this Consent Decree have been met to the satisfaction of the BOARD.

PUBLICATION OF CONSENT DECREE

DFH acknowledges that at the time this Consent Decree becomes effective, it also becomes a public document and will be reported to the State of Nevada, Legislative Council Bureau, Disciplinary Action Reporting System; and such other national databases as required by law. It is also understood that any meeting during which the BOARD considers and accepts or rejects this Consent Decree is open to the public and that the minutes of the BOARD meeting are a public document, available for inspection by any person so requesting.

INDEMNIFICATION

DFH, for itself, its heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns, hereby indemnifies and holds harmless the State of Nevada, the BOARD, the Nevada Attorney General's office and each of their members, agents and employees in their individual and representative capacities against any and all claims, suits, demands, actions, debts,

damages, costs, charges, and expenses, including court costs and attorney's fees against 1 any persons, entities, as well as all liability, losses, and damages of any nature 2 whatsoever that the persons and entities named in this paragraph shall have or may at 3 any time sustain or suffer by reason of this investigation, this disciplinary action, this 4 settlement or its administration. 5

STIPULATED FACTS AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

7 DFH understands the nature of the allegations under consideration by the BOARD. It acknowledges that the conduct alleged in the Complaint, if proven, constitutes 8 violations of the Nevada Board of Funeral and Cemetery Services Practice Act (NRS and 9 NAC 642) and NRS Chapter 451. It further recognizes that if this matter were to be 10 11 taken to a disciplinary hearing before the BOARD, there is a substantial likelihood that the following allegations could be proven as true, and that as a result it would be subject 12 to disciplinary action by the BOARD. As such, DFH does not contest the following allegations: 14

DFH held a valid permit to operate a funeral establishment on the date of 1. 15 16 the alleged violations and continues to hold a valid permit through the present day.

2. The BOARD received a written complaint on or about March 16, 2016, alleging that decedents were not being cremated or buried within a reasonable time after death, specifically, cases receiving payment from Clark County Social Services.

3. The investigation revealed one (1) decedent who died October 6, 2015, and 20 came into custody of DFH on November 4, 2015, but was not cremated until March 8, 21 2016 even though all paperwork was complete and Clark County Social Services had 22 23 approved the payment January 26, 2016.

NRS 642.5174(12) states that unprofessional conduct includes violation of 4. 24 any state law or municipal or county ordinance or regulation affecting the handling, 25 custody, care or transportation of dead human bodies, including, without limitation, 26 chapters 440, 451, and 452 of NRS. 27

25	DFH stipulates that pursuant to the authority of NRS 642.5176, its establishmen		
26	permit number EST26 shall be placed on probation for six (6) months. During the term of		
27	probation, DFH agrees to comply with the following conditions:		
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1. Within thirty (30) days of the approval and execution of this Consent Decree, DFH shall pay One Hundred Fifty Four dollars (\$154.00) in legal and investigative fees.

No grace period is permitted. Full payment not actually received by a. the BOARD on or before the thirty days as indicated above, shall be construed as an event 4 5 of default by DFH.

6 b. In the event of default, DFH agrees that its establishment permit shall be immediately suspended. The suspension of DFH's permit shall continue until the 7 unpaid balance is paid in full and the suspension is subject to being reported to all 8 appropriate agencies. 9

DFH acknowledges that the BOARD has the legal power and 10 C. authority to take action against it, including instituting debt collection actions for unpaid 11 monetary assessments in this case. 12

2. DFH shall submit a report on the last day of each month of probation which 13 includes a list of all decedents under its care, who have not received burial or cremation 14 within 45 days of death. The report shall include an explanation for any reasons for delay 15 in disposition and efforts that have been made to ensure timely cremation or burial.

3. DFH shall enter at least the minimum available decedent information into the Electronic Death Registry System ("EDRS") within seven (7) days of taking custody of 18 the remains of the decedent. 19

4. DFH shall submit to a monthly inspection for the term of the probation 20 period to verify compliance with the terms of the Consent Decree. 21

22 5. DFH shall obey all federal, state and local laws, and orders of the BOARD, which are not inconsistent with this Consent Decree, pertaining to the operation of a 23 24 funeral establishment in this State. From the date of execution of this Consent Decree until DFH satisfies the terms of the Stipulated Adjudication section, DFH shall report 25 any and all violations to the BOARD in writing within seventy-two (72) hours. 26

6. DFH agrees that it will be financially responsible for all requirements of this 27 28 Consent Decree, including the cost of any reasonable financial assessments by the

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BOARD for the cost of monitoring its compliance or carrying out the provisions of this
Consent Decree upon a determination of non-compliance with the provisions of this
Consent Decree.

7. After a minimum of six (6) months, DFH may apply to the BOARD for 4 termination of its probation and full reinstatement of its establishment permit number 5 EST26. DFH understands that prior to terminating its probation and full reinstatement 6 of its permit it must prove to the BOARD's satisfaction that it has complied with all the 7 terms and conditions of its Consent Decree. DFH shall submit a written request to the 8 9 BOARD for termination of its probation. Upon receipt of this request, the BOARD may request additional information from DFH to determine its compliance with the Consent 10 Decree. Upon establishing DFH has met all of the requirements of the Consent Decree, 11 its legal owner/representative shall meet with the Chair of the BOARD or his/her 12 designee, the Executive Director and BOARD counsel for evaluation of its compliance 13 with the Consent Decree and for their recommendation of termination of probation, full 14 reinstatement, or additional disciplinary action at a separate hearing before the BOARD. 15

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VIOLATION OF TERMS OF CONSENT DECREE

DFH understands that the BOARD may, upon thirty (30) days' notice to DFH, 17 convene a hearing for the limited purpose of establishing that it violated the terms of this 18 Consent Decree. It is agreed by all parties that in establishing if any terms of this 19 20 Consent Decree have been violated, only the cases that fall within the probationary period shall be considered; any previous cases shall not be part of any hearings under the terms 21 of this Consent Decree. If such a hearing results in a finding of a violation of this Consent 22 Decree, the BOARD may impose any penalty upon DFH authorized by NRS 642.5176 23 including, but not limited to, revocation of its permit to operate a funeral establishment in 24 the State of Nevada. 25

DFH agrees to waive its right to appeal the substantive legal basis of the original disciplinary action, which is the basis for this Consent Decree. In the event an alleged violation of the Consent Decree is taken to hearing and the facts which constitute the violation are determined to be not proven, no disciplinary action shall be taken by the
BOARD.
<u>ACCEPTANCE BY THE BOARD</u>
This Consent Decree will be presented and accepted by the BOARD with a
recommendation for approval from the Attorney General's Office at its next meeting.

COMPLETE CONSENT DECREE

This Consent Decree embodies the entire agreement between the BOARD and DFH. It may not be altered, amended, or modified without the express written consent of the parties.
